

## Highlanders top Oak Ridge

The Woodlands completes undefeated District schedule

SHENANDOAH, Texas - Junior <u>Chris Andritsos</u>threw for 279 yards and connected with senior Tyler Patrick on four touchdown passes to lead The Woodlands Highlanders to a 46-21 win over the Oak Ridge War Eagles Friday night at Woodforest Bank Stadium.

"We talk at halftime and make some adjustments on offense and defense. Hats off to our kids as they have done an excellent job this season making second half adjustments. Our kids are starting to take a lot of pride in being a second half football team," said Highlander Head Coach Mark Schmid.

The Woodlands (8-2, 6-0) scored on its first three possessions of the third quarter along with a 61-yard punt return for touchdown by Tyler Patrick to break open a close game to become outright District 14-5A champions.

Senior running back Sterling Scott ran up the middle 75 yards to the 2-yard line on the first play of the third quarter, immediately seizing the momentum. Junior <u>Patrick Carr</u> plunged in from the 2 to give The Woodlands a 27-14 lead just 39 seconds into the third quarter.

The Highlander offense continued to be explosive as Andritsos connected with junior wide receiver Chris Bell on a 67-yard completion down to the War Eagle 14-yard line. The drive would stall and senior Ryan Spaulding kicked a 25-yard field goal to give The Woodlands a 30-14 lead with 5:51 left in the third quarter.

"We can't come out in the second half and give up big plays against a quality team. We are going to evaluate film and continued to get better, our kids played hard and didn't quit and that's always a positive," said War Eagle Head Coach Dereck Rush.

After an Oak Ridge (7-3, 3-3) turnover on downs, the Highlanders continued to churn out the big play. Chris Andritsos connected with Patrick for a 28-yard touchdown, the duo's fourth scoring combination of the night, extending the Highlander lead to 37-14. Tyler Patrick wasn't done,

scoring his fifth touchdown of the night, a 61-yard punt return at the end of the third quarter to give the Highlanders a commanding 44-14 lead.

"Our run game really opened up our passing game, I give all credit to our lineman and our quarterback (Andritsos). Our defense showed up and played their heart out," Patrick said.

Oak Ridge trailed 7-0 in the first quarter and began to gain momentum on its third possession when senior quarterback Jacob Norton completed a short screen pass on a third-and-8 for a first down. The War Eagles then went to the wildcat formation with junior running back Kwame Etwi taking the snaps and went on a 71-yard scoring drive. The drive was capped off by Etwi's 9-yard run up the middle to tie the game 7-7 with 3:36 left in the first quarter.

The War Eagles took advantage of a short field due to a 22-yard punt by The Woodlands on their next possession. Oak Ridge went 32 yards in five plays in 1:27, capped off by junior fullback Justin Edwards 2-yard touchdown run on the first play of the second quarter to take a 14-7 lead.

The Woodlands would respond by going on a 70-yard drive in nine plays and an 85-yard drive in nine plays on back-to-back possessions. Both scoring drives were capped off by Andritsos finding Patrick for touchdowns, a 13-yard wide receiver screen, and a 36-yard pass over the middle in the end zone to take a 21-14 halftime lead.

Both teams qualified for postseason play in the Class 5A Division I bracket. Oak Ridge will play district 13-5A champion Spring Westfield (10-0) at Leonard George Stadium in Spring on Thursday, November 14 at 7:00 p.m.. The Woodlands will host district 13-5A runner-up Klein (6-4) at Woodforest Bank Stadium on Friday, November 15, at 7:00 p.m..



## <u>Patrick, The Woodlands rout Oak Ridge,</u> <u>claim outright 14-5A title</u>

SHENANDOAH — Football fans at Woodforest Bank Stadium on Friday night paid \$7 for admission to The Woodlands-Oak Ridge football game. What they got was The Tyler Patrick Show.

The senior wide receiver scored five touchdowns — four through the air and one on a punt return — to lead the No. 6 Highlanders (8-2, 6-0) to a 46-21 victory over the War Eagles (7-3, 3-3). With the win, The Woodlands clinched an outright District 14-5A championship.

"It feels good to accomplish it, but we've just got to get back to work Monday to prepare for (bi-district opponent) Klein," Patrick said.

Patrick, who was The Courier's Player of the Week last week, finished with five catches for 129 yards and touchdowns of 36, 13, 38 and 28 yards, respectively. For good measure, he added a 61-yard punt return for another score in the third quarter.

Quarterback Chris Andritsos also had a standout performance, completing 14 of 20 passes for 279 yards and four scores.

"Tyler Patrick had a big night receiving, returned a punt, and I think Chris Andritsos felt like he was the go-to guy," The Woodlands coach Mark Schmid said. "We needed that connection tonight, and it was a great night for those guys."

Three of Patrick's touchdown catches came in the first half, giving The Woodlands a 21-14 lead at the break. The War Eagles' 14 first-half points came from two touchdown runs — a nine-yarder by Kwame Etwi and a three-yarder by Justin Edwards.

But it was all Highlanders in the second half, as they outscored Oak Ridge 25-7.

"We talk about stuff at halftime, and we do make some adjustments on offense and defense," Schmid said. "Hats off to our kids. They take those adjustments and have done an excellent job this football season in the second half. We have done some good things in the second half, and I think our kids are starting to take a lot of pride in being a second-half football team."

The Highlanders started that second half off with a bang, as senior running back Sterling Scott broke off a 75-yard run down to the Oak Ridge 2.

Patrick Carr scored up the middle on the next play, and The Woodlands took a 27-14 advantage after a missed extra point. Scott finished with six carries for 122 yards.

"He is a huge compliment to Patrick Carr," Schmid said of Scott. "He's tough to tackle, he has great balance and he's a big part of our offense. We don't hesitate to put him in there because we feel like he's always going to give us a spark."

Later in the third quarter, Ryan Spaulding added a 25-yard field goal, Andritsos hit Patrick for a yet another touchdown and Patrick electrified the Highlander faithful with a 61-yard punt return up the left sideline.

"We had a lot of blockers, so I just had to outrun the kicker, basically," Patrick said. "That's all you can ask for."

The Woodlands linebacker Tanner Birdsong sacked Oak Ridge quarterback Jacob Norton in the end zone for a safety a few seconds into the fourth quarter. Edwards scored on a one-yard run for the War Eagles to cap the scoring.

The Woodlands will take on Klein in the first round of the playoffs at 7 p.m. next Friday at Woodforest Bank Stadium.

Oak Ridge will take on No. 4 Westfield at 7 p.m. next Thursday at Leonard George Stadium in Spring.
